Disappointments will come in life; it has no boundaries and will show up wherever and whenever it decides. The focus should not be on how to avoid disappointment, but how to respond when it shows up. The world's approach to disappointment is a "woe is me", response, filled with murmuring and complaining. "Why me!" "I can't catch a break; it always happens to me!" How are we to process disappointment as believers? How do we love God in life's disappointments? As a member of the Body of Christ we should apply and follow the instructions and examples found the in the scriptures. 1 Thessalonians 5: 16-18 (NKJV), "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, in everything give thanks...

The first thing we should do is respond with praise and thanksgiving. This might seem odd. Why would I give praise and thanksgiving during a disappointing time? So many times, we are told what to do without and an under-

standing of why we do things a certain way. The mouth is a powerful weapon and what comes out of it can make your situation better or much worse. The Israelites murmuring and complaining along with their actions turned an eleven-day journey into 40 years. Proverbs 18:21 (AMP), "Death and life are in the power of the tongue, and those who love it and indulge it will eat its fruit and bear the consequences of their words." When your mouth is filled with praise there is no room for murmuring and complaining.

There is protection in praising and giving honor to God. Look at the story of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego found in the 3rd chapter of Daniel. In verses 16-18, they identified and remedied the disappointment in one statement., all while giving God the honor and glory. We all know how the situation worked out. As a result of the three Hebrew boys responding well in their disappointment, it led to promotion and had non-believers confessing and giving honor and glory to God. Disappointment can turn into blessings, not just for yourself but others as well.

Think of disappointments as steppingstones along the path that God has for you. Remember what is meant for evil, God can use for good. When disappointment comes, remember to respond well. Watch what comes out of your mouth., speak blessings over your situation and not curses. Find scriptures that speak to your situation and keep them at the forefront of your mind, mouth, and heart. Proverbs 12:25(NKJV)" Anxiety in the heart of man causes depression, but a good word makes it glad." The way to love God in life's disappointments is to follow his instructions and be an example to the world, that brings him all the glory and honor.

"LIVING A LIFE OF SERVANTHOOD"

SISTER PATTIE MOBLEY - EDWARD R. DAVIE MISSIONS



The forty-First Annual Edward R. Davie Missions Conference is centered around the theme "Being Fruitful in Every Good Work." (Colossians 1:10) I was asked to give thought to the subject "Living a Life of Servanthood." I quickly agreed but it didn't take long for me to question what I was going to say to my Fellow Servants and a Convention of Believers, those who have already

come to an understanding that they are servants.

The spirit led me to ponder the key word in my topic, which is "LIFE." Sometimes we try to make a distinction between our "regular" life and our "ministry/ servanthood" life. There is no such distinction. We are servants of the Creator, and everything we do and say must reflect that reality. By the grace of God, we are "Living a Life of Servanthood." Some of you might be saying I don't know what my actual service is. Don't worry! Roman 12:6A tells us that we have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. Then verse 7A reads "if it is serving, then serve." 1 Corinthians 12 beginning at verse 7 says" Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good. All these are the work of the same Spirit, and He distributes them to each one, just as He determines."

When we think of service, we often make it about ourselves. We want to know what we are good at. We want to have talent that is on the same level as someone who has it all together. Even if we don't want to admit it, we often want to use our gifts to demonstrate ourselves to others. The question isn't "What do I do well?" but "How can I best serve others with what God has given me?" Today we will look at 5 Biblical Truths that we, as servant, possess and will continue to embrace during our Life of Servanthood.

#1 We are led by the Spirit: Being led by the Spirit is a Biblical key to a life of servanthood. God never intended for us to go it alone. He gave us His Son and the Holy Spirit to help us. In John 15:1-8. Jesus is talking to his disciples, about 24 hours before he is to be crucified. The illustration is that of a vineyard, which involves a vine dresser, the vine, and the branches. Jesus says, My Father is the vine dresser, and he has a lot of work to do tending the garden; He created it, so he knows what it needed to grow. Secondly, Jesus said, I am the vine and I have a lot of work to do to by way of the vine dresser to make sure all the nutrients and life-giving sources are provided to produce eternal fruit. Then he points to the disciples and says you are the branches. He points to the only thing in a working vineyard that does not work. He says to "Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself, it must remain in the vine." The branches only focus is staying connected to the vine. If we stay focused on keeping our connection to vine secure, then by default we will produce fruit. It is by the Spirit that we are Living a life servanthood. John 15:1-8 Zechariah 4:6 John 6: 63 Proverbs 3:5-8

#2 – We follow The Master's master principle: Jesus was a revolutionary, not in a warfare sense, but in His teaching on servanthood. The term servant sometime expressed low honor. Jesus used the term as a synonym for greatness. That was a revolutionary idea. Jesus spent all his earthly life doing the work of his Father that no one else could do. In John 13:12-15, he did something that anyone could, but nobody wanted to. He washed the feet of his Disciples. He clearly tells His Disciples and us that we are to follow his example. Is not so much an action as it is an attitude of humble service that should accompany all we do. By doing so, he both dignifies and demands from His followers' humble acts of service. Why? Because doing so brings us face to face with the reality that Godly work is performed for the benefit of others, not merely for the fulfillment of ourselves.

If Jesus modeled servanthood and held it up as the spirit and make it the word and will of God. Costandard for leadership in His kingdom. Shouldn't lossians 4:2 we hold the same standard in His kingdom here on earth? We should never abandon the towel and basin!

#3 – We are People of the Bible: One of the best things you can do to make yourself a better, more fruitful servant is to be a person of the Bible! James in chapter 1:22-25 describes what the life of genuine, trusting, saving faith looks like. James makes it clear that those who trust God don't merely become experts at listening to God's Word. To believe is to act on what we hear. The doctrines of the Bible are designed to produce deeds – good deeds. Whatever your service is, there are going to be time when you are going to give counsel or advice. You might even have to reproof, correct, or train in righteousness. We have access to knowledge that is unshakably true and infinitely valuable. We are better equipped to serve when we use the teachings of the Bible in all our good work. Those we serve need God's Word. Opinions come and go, only God's opinion matters!

Isiah 55:11 James 1:22 -25 2 Timothy 3:14-17

#4 – We are People of Prayer: Prayer is one of the greatest privileges we have as a Christian. However, we often make prayer something more complicated than it is and as a result miss the power of prayer in our Servanthood. As followers of Christ, we are committed to a lifestyle of prayer. Prayer should not be reserved just for the most extreme circumstances or when something bad happens and it should not be relegated to just some religious function. God wants to connect with us. For the Christian, praying should be like breathing. Just as breathing is the response of physical life to the presence of air,` so prayer should be the response of spiritual life to the presence of God! Make it a habit, make is stimulating, make it by the James 5:16-18

#5 - We possess a Servant's Mentality: The Word of God lays a solid, biblical foundation for what it means to have a servant mentality. You must have a mentality that says, "My purpose on this earth is to serve God." The attitude of a faithful servant should be like the attitude of Jesus, who humbled Himself and took on the nature of a servant. The motivation of a faithful servant is no matter what we do, we are to do everything to the glory of God. In the Great Commission of Matthew 28:18-20, Jesus gives instruction on the work of a faithful servant. He instructed His followers to make disciples of all nations, baptizing them and teaching them to obey everything Jesus commanded. Luke 12:37-38 tells us, amazingly, that for those servants who are found faithful, watching, and ready when the Master returns, He will come, seat them at the table and wait on them. In the last chapter of the Bible Jesus says, "Behold, I am coming soon! My reward is with me, and I will give to everyone according to what he has done" Philippians 2:5-11 1st Corinthians 10:31 Matthew 28:18 -20 Revelation 22:22

"LOVE IN A BAG" BENEFITS L. P. MILES ELEMENTARY SCHOOL



Pastor Stowers informed the MCBC family of a need in our community of Adamsville. After explaining the details of the need, the church family happily agreed to support the ministry of "Love in A Bag." We learned that help is needed in providing food items for lunch bags weekly for students at L.P. Miles Elementary School. Approximately 50 students are homeless, some are staying in hotels and others experience food insecurity, meaning they don't always know where they will get their next meal. For many of them, having breakfast and lunch at school helps during the week, but they often lack the resources when they are not in school.

Love in a Bag started in August and will end in May 2024. Led by the Mission Ministry, volunteers from the various Mt. Calvary ministries gathered

weekly on Thursday to assemble 50 bags that are transported to the school to be handed out on Friday. The goal is to provide meals on Saturday and Sunday. Students receive items that will cover 2 breakfasts, 2 lunches, 2 dinners, water or juice and snacks. SWEEAC provides 5 items per child each week. They include 1 each: chips, crackers, breakfast bar, juice, and fruit snacks. Mt. Calvary adds cereal, chef Boyardee item, cup of noodles, peanut butter crackers, pretzels, and water. (Items are rotated weekly). Volunteers now gather at the church every 3 weeks to assemble 150 bags of food items, enough to cover 3 weekends for 50 students. The love and fellowship among the volunteers are evident as we all work together to assemble the bags under the efficient leadership of Sis. Ilene Simmons. Volunteers also assist with counting items in the storeroom to keep an accurate record of items needed before purchasing additional items needed.

Food List of items purchased include (50 of each) Non-perishable food, chips, water, oatmeal, grits, cup of noodles, raisins, breakfast bars, fruit cups, fruit snacks, snack cakes. Individual cereal bowls or boxes, granola bars, juice boxes, Pop Tarts, pretzels, popcorn, individual packaged crackers, Slim Jims, tuna on the go, chicken on the go, macaroni and cheese in microwave cups, Chef Boyardee variety pack, peanut butter crackers and apple sauce.
