In Catholic countries of Europe, it has been celebrated on March 19 as Saint Joseph's Day since the Middle Ages. In the United States, Father's Day was founded by Sonora Smart Dodd, and celebrated on the third Sunday of June for the first time in 1910. The day is held on various dates across the world, and different regions maintain their own traditions of honoring fatherhood. Happy Father's Day!

Juneteenth (officially Juneteenth National Independence Day and also known as Jubilee Day, Emancipation Day, Freedom Day, and Black Independence Day) is a federal holiday in the United States commemorating the emancipation of enslaved African-Americans. It is also often observed African-American culture. celebrating Originating in Galveston, Texas, it has been celebrated annually on June 19 in various parts of the United States since 1865. The day was recognized as a federal holiday on June 17, 2021, when President Joe Biden signed the Juneteenth National Independence Day Act into law. Juneteenth's commemoration is on the anniversary date of the June 19, 1865, announcement of General Order No. 3 by Union Army general Gordon Granger, proclaiming freedom for enslaved people in Texas, which was the last state of the Confederacy with institutional slavery. When Juneteenth became a federal holiday on June 17, 2021, it was the first

MCBC Worshippers Returns for Weekly In-Person Worship on Sundays



After 2 plus years of following Covid-19 Pandemic Guidelines for Houses of Worship, and under the leadership of **Pastor Douglas Stowers** and the efforts of the Re-Entry Committee members (**Deacons Robert Felton, S.J. Tuck, Jonathan Kelly, and Sisters Annette Smith, Patti P. Mobley, Thedda Edwards, Gayle McDaniel and Shirley Seymour), the MCBC sanctuary was opened for regular in-person worship each Sunday beginning in May 2022. The committee met regularly and prayerfully considered when we would be led by God to re-enter the sanctuary. We established guidelines for re-entry to include: register for in-person worship, show proof of Covid-19 vaccination, temperature checks, wear a mask at all times, and social distance seating during service. While Live-Streaming of worship services on Facebook continues for MCBC members and friends who are unable to attend in-person worship, those in attend-**
