“THE FUTURE OF OUR YOUTH”

As we have ended 2023 and stepped into 2024, we are so thankful for our youth and for what they have done this past year and the promises of what they are going to do in 2024. Our youth are showing their gifts and talents as they continue to give excellent presentations during worship service on the fourth Sunday with their presentations during A Moment In Black History. On the fifth Sunday they are given the responsibility of leading the congregation in worship. In the previous article written about our youth ministry, it was mentioned tentative dates for two upcoming events, Bang the Gavel, and the youth outing to Calloway Gardens. I will take a moment and expound on the details of these two events.

On Saturday, August 22nd, 2023, twenty-eight (28) youth and adults visited Calloway Gardens for an all-day outing. Our youth enjoyed swimming and wadding on the beach, visiting several other venues that were on site and ending the day by attending the circus presented by Calloway Gardens. Our youth enjoyed the beach so much that many of them requested us to bring them back again and again. On August 28, 2023, eight (8) youth from Mt. Calvary and five (5) youth from local High Schools in the community rose early to attend and participate in the Fulton

County Magistrate Court program “Bang the Gavel.” Special thanks to Mrs. Linda Gardner & Mrs. Mildred Byrd for volunteering their time to assist as needed chaperones for this group event. During the Bang the Gavel outing, the youth had the opportunity to meet and greet many of the Magistrate Court judges and key staff. The youth also had the opportunity to observe a civil court trial and participated in a mock criminal court trial lead by Magistrate Court Chief Judge, Cassandra Kirk. Our youth role played all the characters needed to make up and present this trial. Their role-playing skills were just outstanding.

Please continue to pray for and encourage our youth as they actively continue to participate in our youth ministry. Finally, I would like to share five good reasons why it is important to bring your children to church:

1. Bringing your child/children to Church frequently, (preferable weekly) helps develop a habit. In (Proverbs 22:6) the Bible instructs parents to train up a child in the way he or

she should go, and when he or she is old, they won't depart from it. Regularly bringing your child to church means on Sunday morning getting them out of bed and away from those games helps inspire responsibility and accountability. It is a known fact, when youth participate regularly in activities at church, they are learning responsibility and accountability. Even if they have chores at home, it is important for them to learn responsibility in a variety of other ways.

When children are given responsibility like helping lead worship, singing in the choir, participating as ushers, helping collect the offering, assisting with opening the door for elderly church members and visitors, they are learning that their help is an important part of making church happen.

2. Regularly attending church helps them with their problem-solving skills.

Just because it is church doesn't mean there won't be problems! While in church they might get the opportunity to observe how to get a cranky baby to cheer up? Several other members may

not show up for their duties, therefore, they might observe how improvisations or adjustments are made to continue worship. They might witness the electronic screen & TV monitors or PA system going out, but the worship service continues. When key members don't show up, the Pastor makes adjustments and still delivers an exceptional spirit filled sermon.

3. Attending church regularly helps build Confidence

– When children serve at church, it builds their confidence. Children need to be given things to do so they can feel needed and important. When they do something well and are thanked or acknowledged by church members and leaders. This small act of kindness significantly helps to build a child's self-esteem into believing they can do more.

4. Regularly attending church helps build healthy relationships

– When youth are at church, they are surrounded by other Godly people treating each other with respect. Many kids today just don't have this at home or at school. They don't know how a

Godly man or woman acts or behaves because they don't have anyone like that in their life to model after. By frequently attending and serving at church, they can observe more of other adults interacting positively and treating each other Godly. They can see healthy ways to deal with issues or stressful situations.

5. Regularly attending church expands the possibility of finding mentors.

Every child needs a mentor of some kind. By serving at church, they will be serving alongside Godly men and women who can pour into them, encourage them, and even take them under their wing. This is especially true for children that don't have the best home life or positive people in their lives.

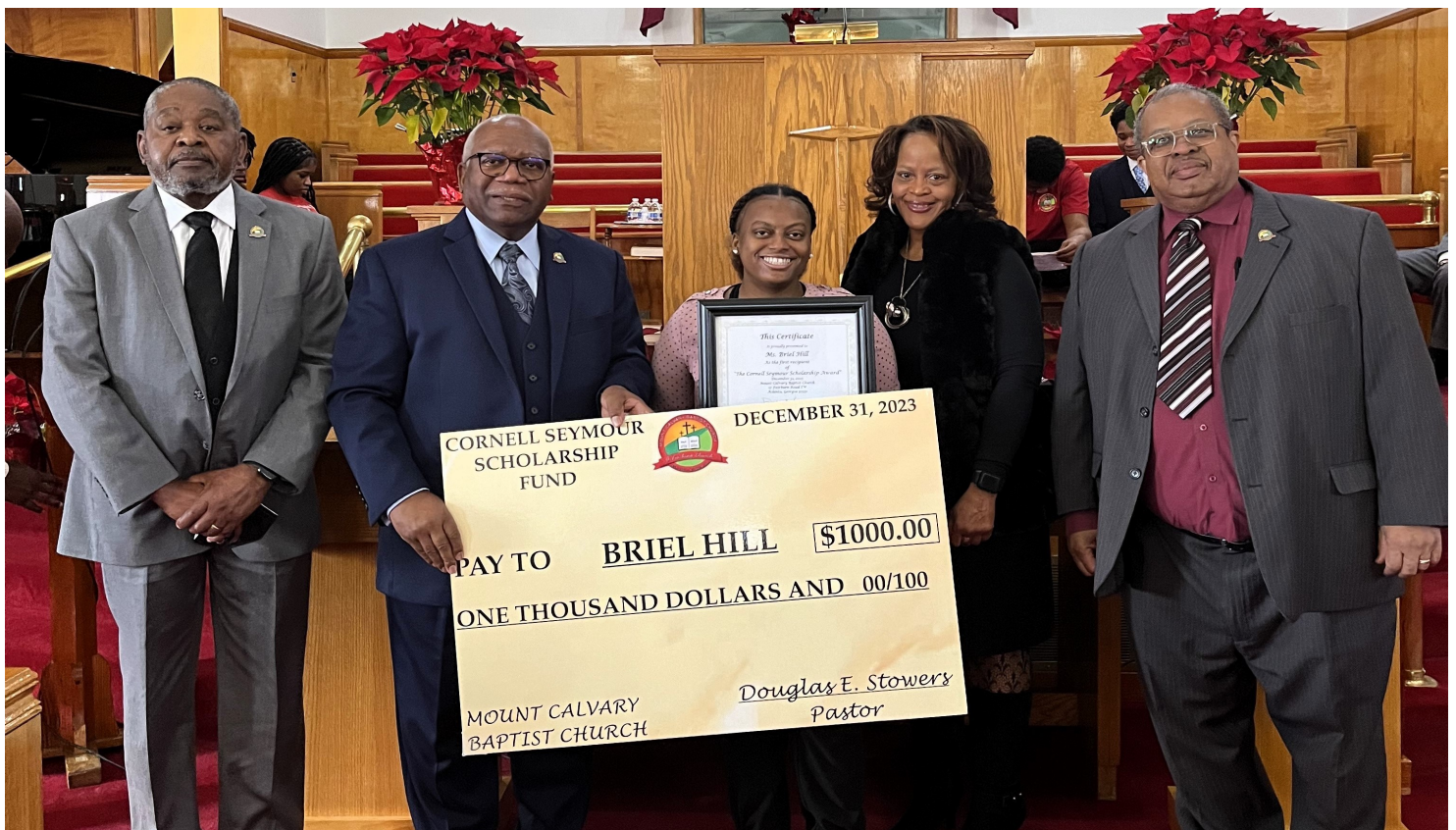
I am excited about God's promise for our youth ministry in 2024 simply because God has blessed us with so much this past year. My motto for 2024, **"With God's Help Bring It On."**
